SURVIVOR STORY

"Family support keeps me moving on!"

"It's been 10 years. I dare not say I've combated it and won completely, yet I've learnt how to live my life fully!"Vivian, who fought the strike of breast cancer twice, said cheerfully.

Towards the end of 1996, Vivian detected a small lump on her breast accidentally. She consulted the doctor when she went for a gynecology check-up. The doctor comforted her that it might be a short term sign of menstruation. But Vivian was still in doubt. Her doctor thus referred her to a specialist for further examination. After various blood tests, x-ray screening and biopsy, the doctor told Vivian that calcification points were found on her breast. The diagnosis of first stage breast cancer was put in black and white in the examination report.

Vivian recalled the moment when she was diagnosed with breast cancer - she did not know how to respond. She was too shocked to cry and kept asking the doctor what happened. "The doctor repeated the same answer thrice: it's breast cancer, you need a surgery!"

"On Vacation" in the Hospital

From Winter solstice to Christmas of the year, Vivian spent 10 days in the hospital. It's an unforgettable experience - Vivian realized that she was not alone there. Her families and friends were with her. "My husband and son went to the hospital to see me every day; my husband used up all of his annual leave to look after me. That has never happened since we got married. Before I got the disease, we kept ourselves busy and worked very hard for the family. We did not have much time to communicate with each other. But in the 10 days "vacation" of mine in the hospital, I really felt his love and care. The intimacy between us has come back suddenly." All the supports and encouragements from her husband and son gave her motivation in the course of fighting the cancer.



After recovery, Vivian returned to her work. Hectic work distracted her from personal health care. One day in 2008, Vivian detected a small lump under the armpit on the side of her breast affected by breast cancer. Medical examination confirmed that the tissues were harmful. She was advised to go through chemotherapy or radiotherapy.

Ten years on, Vivian has been doing well in recovery. She realised that exercise is crucial to cancer prevention. "After the first surgery, I did exercise and walked in the park often at the beginning, and the feeling was very good. As I got busier with my work later, I did less exercise. As a result, my condition became worse again." During the chemotherapy period, a friend recommended Qi Gong to Vivian. This time she dares not lazy again. She has kept a habit of practicing Qi Gong for two hours every morning since then.

Surviving the disease, Vivian has a different perspective towards life. She is no longer a workaholic, and has got to know how to treasure life after the recurrence. She lives a disciplined life with regular exercise and healthy diet. In the treatment process, she realised that hers was not the worst case. Many other women suffer more severe situationthan she did. Being grateful, she has committed to voluntary work in the hospital to help other patients.

Vivian advises all her fellows that cancer is not incurable. Listen to the doctor's advice, using both Chinese and western medical treatments, be confident in modern treatment; be determined to undertake the treatments; don't be afraid of the pains. Be persistent on taking good care of oneself. Learn to "release" and "relax" oneself; let everything follow the flow. Then life can be very wonderful in the days ahead!

Selfless Giving: Volunteer Yeung Tai Yee

Work like lettershopping and data entry seems like nitty- gritty things, but they are vital to smooth operation of every organisation. Every Tuesday, our volunteer Yeung Tai Yee is at HKBCF office helping on the general office work. She does not mind at all. "I am a quiet person; it is very suitable for me to work here."

"Help others help themselves" is the belief that drives her to work as a volunteer. "Sometimes I hear the staff at HKBCF and volunteers comforting the breast cancer patients over the phone. They also arrange breast cancer survivors to share their experiences with others. I feel the work of this organisation can really help people."

Tai Yee is very health conscious. She does exercise such as Taichi and hiking regularly. She has enriched her knowledge on breast cancer after joining HKBCF as a volunteer. "I am always conscious about breast health. I always remind my friends of screening. Having learnt more about breast cancer from HKBCF, I realise that Hong Kong has a very high incidence rate of breast cancer. That alerts me to pay more attention to my lifestyle. I also encourage my friends who have breast cancer to contact HKBCF for support services."

Tai Yee has been a long-serving volunteer since HKBCF inauguration. "I am very happy that HKBCF is gradually growing. All the staff here are very friendly. We chat and laugh. The feeling of working here is pretty good." Tai Yee is prepared to continue volunteering to HKBCF, and would suggest her friends to join too.

Breast Cancer Facts in Hong Kong 2008 Report

In Hong Kong, breast cancer is the leading cancer among women. In recent years, Hong Kong tops Asian countries and cities in terms of crude and age-standardised incidence rate. According to the latest figures released by the Hong Kong Cancer Registry, there were over 2,700 new breast cancer cases, or about 8 women are diagnosed with breast cancer each day.

In order to understand the local breast cancer, we have completed the first "Breast Cancer Facts in Hong Kong 2008 Report" which analyses 1,006 breast local cancer cases in private clinics. The median age of these breast cancer patients is 47.6, compared to USA (61 years old), Australia (62 years old) and Singapore (50 years old); the diagnosed age is relatively younger.

According to the report, 80% of the breast cancer patients were incidental self detected, whereas 20% were detected through breast screening modalities such as screening mammogram, screening ultrasound, regular clinical breast examination and regular breast self-examination. Those incidental self-detected breast cancer patients, the tumor sizes were relatively bigger than those detected through ordinary screening, thus regular breast examination is an important step to healthcare.

For treatments, the majority of breast cancer patients (99.8%) underwent surgical operation to remove tumours, 71% with radiation therapy, 58% with endocrine therapy. As for the invasive breast cancer patients, 71% were treated with chemotherapy, 11% were treated with targeted therapy.

For breast cancer high risk factors, the report also discovered that 74% breast cancer patients were lack of exercise, meaning exercise less than 3 hours per week; 64% never breast feed and 40% were stressful.

We further analysed the psychological condition of the cases. Results show that less than 60% were positive in their attitudes; patients who underwent breast surgery have relatively low self-image, 80% changed their lifestyle, 71 % changed their dietary habit, 47% reduced workload or quitted their job and 32 % took healthcare products.

As for negative emotion management, 30% claimed that they would divert their attention; 10% chose to ignore the negative emotions; 6% felt depressed, and 70% always or occasionally worried about recurrence. The analysis can serve as a reference for patients, carers and medical professionals to improve patient support services.
