

Incidence Trend 1993-2003




1 in every 23 women stands a chance of developing breast cancer in her lifetime




Survey Results



30% of the interviewees consider the risk of women in HK developing Breast Cancer is not high. (1 in every 23 women)


Q: The risks of Hong Kong women developing breast cancer is 1 in 23, do you consider this as high, medium or low?



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46% of the interviewees are not aware of the importance of early detection


Q: When do you think women should start regular breast examination?



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95% of the interviewees have heard of Breast Self Examination (BSE)

71% of the interviewees do not currently perform Breast Self Examination once every month


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Over half of the women between 18-29 never performed Breast Self Examination

% of women never performed Breast Self Examination by age group



Q: Why have you not performed any Breast Self Examination?





95% of interviewees have heard of Clinical Breast Examination (CBE) by doctors


Q: Have you heard of doctors' performed Clinical Breast Examination as a method to early detect breast cancer symptoms?

% of Women never performed Clinical Breast Examination by doctors by age group





% of Women not following recommended frequency to perform Clinical Breast Examination by doctors by age group



Q: Have you heard of mammography as a means to detect early signs of breast cancer?





Q: How often do you undertake mammography?





% of Women never taken a mammography by age group




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Nearly 50% of the high risk age group gave the reason for never having a physical breast examination nor a mammography as they thought they are healthy

Survey Conclusions



Survey Suggests: Hong Kong Women's awareness of Breast Cancer is <u>low</u>

- There is an increasing trend of Hong Kong women developing breast cancer, the risk being 1 in 23, almost 6 new cases per day. The increasing trend for breast cancer cases developing in the younger female age group is even more alarming.
- The youngest patient being only 17 years old!
- It is a worrying sign that 30% of women do not think the ratio of 1 in 23 women will develop breast cancer as high. And nearly 50% of the female population believes it is only necessary to perform any form of breast examination after 30 years old.

Hong Kong Women unaware of the importance of Breast Self Examination in general

- Over 90% of the interviewees have heard of breast self examination, but most of them are unaware of the importance of regularly undertaking such examination, only 29% of the interviewees perform Breast Self Examination monthly.
- Moreover, those who have never taken Breast Self Examination believe they are in good health, and therefore it is not necessary to take such examination.
 - 30% of the interviewees who have never taken Breast Self Examination indicated they do not know how to perform self examination!



Younger women: Ignores the risk of breast cancer because they thought they are still young.

- 54% of the young interviewees have never performed self examination, and over 70% of interviewees do not follow the recommended frequency of taking a physical breast examination by doctors at least once every 3 years.
- Among those who have never taken self examination, nearly 30% believe they are still young, and it is not necessary therefore to have such examination! (28%)



Older women: Do not have a good understanding of the importance of breast examination.

- Survey shows, the high risk women age group (between 40-59) is not fully aware of the risk of breast cancer:
 - Nearly 30% of interviewees in this age group have not even heard of mammography.
 - 85% of them do not follow the recommended frequency to take a mammography once every 2 years, which many of them never had a mammography taken. (72%)



Recommendation from HKBCF

- It is absolutely necessary to increase the awareness of the risk of breast cancer (especially amongst the younger female age group), and the importance of early detection.
- Enhance public education on breast health care and to promote the importance of regular breast self examination.



HKBCF Urges:

- All women should undertake breast self examination regularly:
 - Once every month
 - The best time to do so is one week after menstruation.
 - Women after menopause should also undertake self examination on the first day of each month to avoid forgetting.
- Clinical Breast Examination by Doctor
 - Women aged 20-40 should undertake clinical breast examination by a doctor once every 3 years.
 - Women aged over 40 should undertake clinical breast examination and mammography once every 2 years.
 - Those with close relatives who had breast cancer, should undertake clinical breast examination and mammography once every year.





Education Level





Who is in the high risk bracket?

- The older you get, the higher the risk of developing breast cancer
- Family medical history: Close relatives (e.g. grandmother, mother, sisters) having had breast cancer.
- Diet and Habits: High fat diet, smoking, alcoholic, overweight...
- Late Pregnancy or never had children
- No breast feeding
- Using hormonal supplements after menopause
- Early menstruation/Late Menstruation: First menstruation prior to 12 years old, Menopause after 55
- Hereditary
- Radiation: Lengthy exposure in high radiation environment



Please immediately seek medical help for the following symptoms of Breast Cancer:

- Lumps of any size in the breast or under the armpits
- Change in size and shape of the breasts.
- Spots or sunken skin in the breast area.
- Sunken nipples
- Any form of excretions or blood coming out from the nipples.
- Swollen arm pits or swollen lymph nodes
- Protruding veins in the breast area or showing fatty lumps in the breast area.
